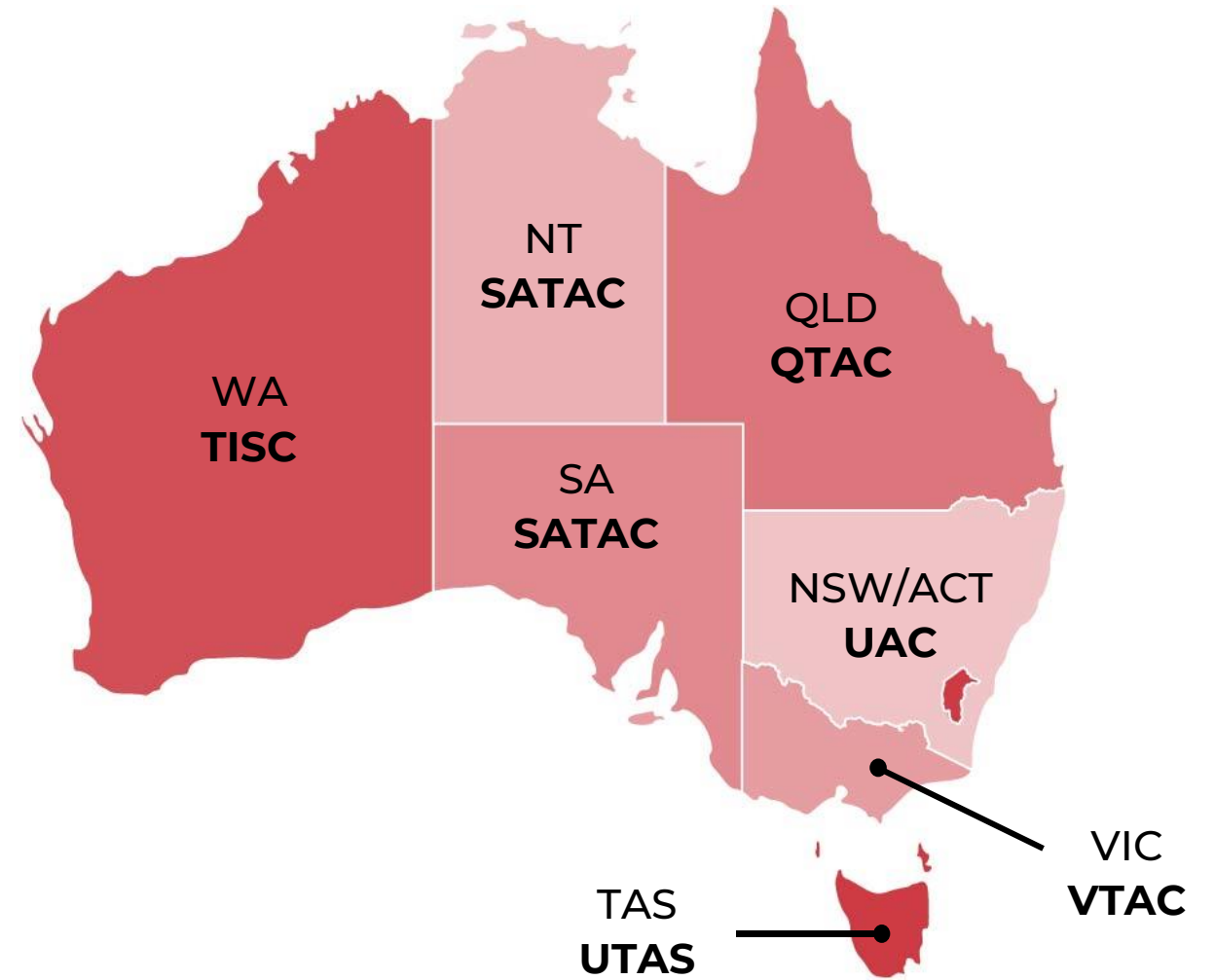

Institutions determine their own rules for admission and QTAC implements them.

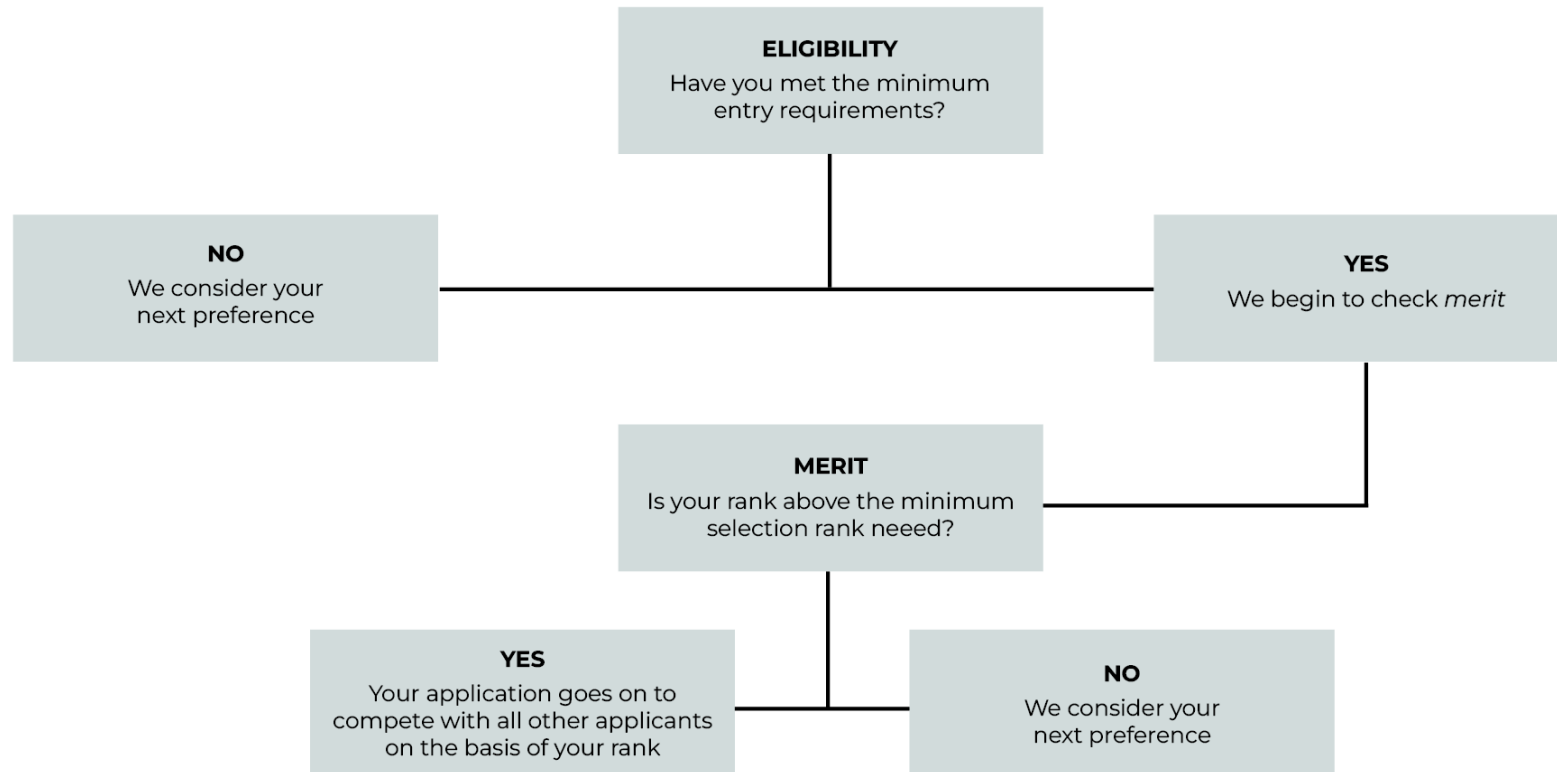
Rules are applied consistently within institutions, but rules change from institution to institution.



Eligibility and Merit

an unbreakable pair

Breaking it down



Eligibility requirements

- Age requirements
- Subject prerequisites
- Portfolios, auditions, or interviews
- Essays or personal statements
- Questionnaires or exams (medicine and dentistry may require UCAT)

Some of these requirements might need to be submitted by a deadline. While researching your courses, make a note of early closing dates:

Nursing and Midwifery

Before you can be considered for a place in a Nursing or Midwifery course, the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC) requires that **all applicants demonstrate their English language proficiency**, regardless of their country of origin or language spoken.

Option 1. English primary language

Option 2. Current AHPRA registration

Option 3. English language proficiency test

Education

For entry to initial teacher education (ITE) courses, applicants need to meet both **academic and non-academic entry requirements**.

Academic entry requirements include subject prerequisites and ATAR/selection rank thresholds.

To meet the **non-academic entry requirements**, applicants must complete a questionnaire that demonstrates they have the key competencies outlined by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) associated with being an effective teacher.

QTAC emails applicants a link to the questionnaire after they apply for an ITE course.

How is merit determined?

Your merit is determined by your QTAC Selection Rank.

Applicants are allocated ranks based on their assessable qualifications.

Selection ranks can come from:

- ATARs
- Overseas Year 12 qualifications
- Completed AQF qualifications (Cert III & IV)
- Diplomas, Advanced Diplomas
- Tertiary study (minimum 2 subjects required)
- Music, dance, and drama qualifications
- Bridging and preparation courses



Meet Harry

Harry is a current Year 12 student on track to receive a Queensland ATAR.

His favourite subjects are Biology and Physics.

He has his sights set on going to university in Brisbane.

Harry's dream career is nursing.



To stay on track for an ATAR, Harry must study:

5 General
subjects

OR

4 General subjects
plus, either:

- 1 Applied subject; or
- Completed Cert III or higher-level VET qualification

The only compulsory subject for ATAR eligibility is English. Harry must complete an English subject with a letter grade of 'C'.

This course develops caring professional nurses who are proactive and adaptable, competent and ethical clinicians, and creative and critical thinkers. Across the course, theory is consistently embedded in clinical practice through the inclusion of one Integrating Practice unit every semester. Clinical placement areas include aged care, community nursing, high dependency nursing, medical/surgical nursing, mental health, paediatrics, palliative care, and perioperative nursing. Students may also take up the opportunity to engage with communities overseas and gain unique educational and cultural experiences working in care facilities in developing countries. Preferences

Before you submit your QTAC application, you will need to make a list of your 6 favourite courses.

This is known as course preferencing.

What is preferencing?

Preferencing is an important part of the application process as **only one offer is received at a time**, based on your **highest eligible preference**.

You can list up to 6 preferences on your application.

If you change your mind, that's okay

You can change your preferences for free 3 times.

You can change your preferences after the application is lodged, even after an offer is made.

It is a good idea to keep 1 of your free changes of preferences until after your ATAR is released.



Back to Harry

Harry knows he really wants to study nursing, but it's a really good idea to have a backup plan.

Harry has been researching backup courses and pathway options, just in case he can't get straight into Nursing.

When it comes time for him to make his course list, he should start by thinking about the order of his list.

If you conditionally accept an offer, you will need to rearrange your preferences so that any other courses you wish to be considered for sit **ABOVE** your conditionally accepted offer.

Note: you can't conditionally accept a first preference. Move the preference down to conditionally accept it.

What else do I need to know about responding to an offer?

- Contact QTAC to check if you can reactivate a previous offer or change the response to your offer.
- If you enrol in a course and no longer wish to study it, withdraw from it with the institution to avoid financial or academic penalties.
- Check your offer email for response information – some institutions will only let you conditionally accept an offer for a short amount of time.
- Some institutions may require you to enrol within a certain timeframe in order to secure your place. Check your offer email for details.



More about Harry

During Year 12, Harry has been struggling with some personal problems and he is worried they will have a negative impact on his grades and his chances of getting into his dream course.

He spoke to one of his teachers about his problems and they told him about QTAC's Educational Access Scheme, which might allow for his ATAR/selection rank to be adjusted.

Adjustment Schemes

Selection Ranks and Adjustment Factors

ATARs are calculated only on the students' actual QCE subject results, which have been scaled.

Adjustment Factors (EAS, subject adjustments, etc) are applied **after** the ATAR is calculated.

Selection Ranks and Adjustment Factors

Applicants may also be assigned a separate Selection Rank for completed VET qualifications.

Depending on the institution, your application may be considered based on the Selection Rank of your completed VET qualification or your adjusted ATAR. For many institutions, your highest rank is considered first.

QTAC continues to administer Adjustment Factor schemes which have been determined by individual institutions.



Educational Access Scheme (EAS)

- Helps if your studies have been negatively affected by circumstances beyond your control
- Applies adjustment points to your rank to help you compete more equitably for an offer
- You can apply to EAS as part of your QTAC application
- Must include all the appropriate application forms and documentary evidence
- Different institutions award different adjustment factors so one may allow more or less adjustments than another

ATAR

What is an ATAR?

- Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)
- Primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions. Indicates a student's position relative to other students
- 2000-point scale from 99.95 down to 0.00. ATARs less than 30.00 are reported as '30 or less'
- Queensland ATAR is calculated by QTAC for entry into tertiary courses. It is the standard pathway to tertiary study in Queensland

QCE and the ATAR

QCE

Certifies learning, showing the individual has achieved a specific standard of education at senior schooling level and may be considered by employers and the general community.




ATAR

Tells us about a student's position (or ranking) compared to all other students in the state. The only intended purpose for the ATAR is to assist with selecting applicants for tertiary study.

Accessing your ATAR

- Current Queensland Year 12 students can open their ATAR account with QTAC from August
- Students who wish to study interstate also need to create an ATAR account
- ATARs will be released in December
- If you wish to apply to commence tertiary study in 2024, you will also need to complete a QTAC application

Setting up your ATAR account

- Use the QCAA version of given names as the first name in the ATAR portal
- Check that date of birth is correct
- LUI number is needed
- Students should set up a personal email address
- If there is an error made, the system will provide the reason for the error, and the student can re-enter their details and try again

Setting up your ATAR account

- Once the registration is complete, the Dashboard shows the student's relevant personal information
- They can also see the data that is held for them, with confirmation from QCAA
- There is a function to enable students to change or update their details by lodging a request for assistance

ATAR Release

- **ATARs are released online only.** There will be a facility to receive ATAR release notification via email and to print a results notice
- Eligible students will be able to print their ATAR Certificate once ATARs have been released
- We have both an appeals and verification process. They sit in the policies page on our website

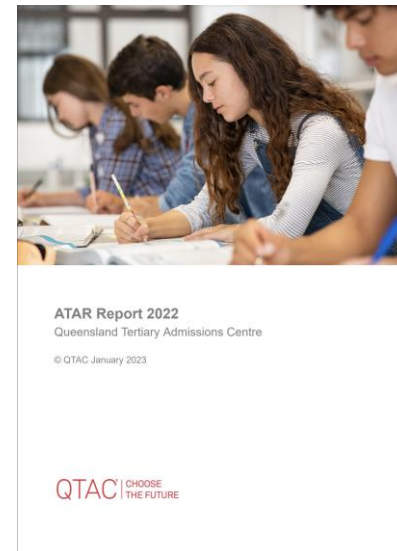
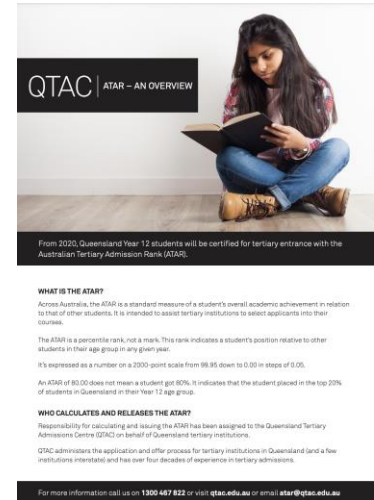
