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Project employment growth by Industry





Figure 2: Projected employment growth by industry - five years to November 2019 ('000)


Projected employment growth by Skill Level


Do we know why we miss out?

Career Example: Psychologist

Counselling Psychologists

Help individuals and groups with personal wellbeing, relationships, work, recreation, health and crisis management

Clinical Neuropsychologists

Assess and manage individuals with brain impairments

Educational and Developmental Psychologists

Provide children and adults with assessment, intervention and counselling services for learning and developmental issues across the life span

Health Psychologists

Promote the prevention and treatment of illness and may work within the health care system

Forensic Psychologists

Providing assessments and interventions for individuals involved in legal proceedings

Careers in Psychology (Cont.)

Community Psychologists

Help people achieve their goals in areas such as welfare and community projects

Organisational Psychologists

Specialise in the areas of work, human resource management, training and development, and market research and advertising

Sport Psychologists

Help people involved in sport and exercise maximise their performance, enjoyment and participation

Clinical Psychologists

Diagnose, treat and prevent a wide range of mental and physical health issues

Academic Psychologists

Conduct Research and Teach in Universities

Career Example: Nurse

Prior to course commencement

All students need to complete a <u>Basic Key Skills Builder (bksb)</u> assessment and achieve a competency of at least Exit Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) in both language and numeracy.

Prior to Vocational Placement

- □ Australian Federal Police Check (AFP)
- □ Working with Children Check (Blue Card)
- □ Current First Aid including CPR completed as part of the course
- □ Immunisations completed (Various)

To register as a Nurse on course completion - Accreditation

- AHPRA registration Australian Health Practitioner registration agency
- Nursing & Midwifery Board National Boards in conjunction with the National Agency (AHPRA) keep public national registers of all registered health practitioners.
- Professional indemnity insurance
- Continuing professional development
- Regency of practice All practitioners must have carried out a certain number of hours of practice, as specified by their National Board


