# Student Uniform Policy

Effective from January 2023



*lifelong life-giving learning*

## Rationale

The Marymount College Uniform Policy is an agreed dress standard for all students attending Marymount.

The Marymount College uniform policy has been developed through a thorough consultation with parents, staff and the wider community. The policy also covers other aspects of the personal presentation of students, especially as ambassadors of the College and its name.

### **The Marymount College Uniform Policy applies to all students when:**

- Attending or representing our school
- Travelling to and from school
- Engaging in school activities out of school hours, including school excursions
- Wearing of the College uniform inside or outside of school hours

### **The Marymount College Uniform Policy aims to contribute to a safe, disciplined and supportive learning environment through:**

- Ready identification of students and non-students at school
- Fostering a strong sense of belonging
- Developing mutual respect among students by minimising visible evidence of an economic or social difference
- Being sun-smart
- Being respectful of the College community and its reputation

## Expectations

It is expected that:

- Students will be role models of College values in word, deed and action in the College uniform.
- The College uniform will be worn in its entirety and not with other non-approved items.
- The College uniform will be worn in accordance with all aspects of the Uniform Code.
- The College uniform must be kept clean, neat and in a good state of repair.
- Students will not harm the reputation of the College while wearing the uniform.
- Students will not upload, through the use of any data carriage service, images and videos of themselves, or others, in the College uniform to any digital platform.

## Free dress days

Free dress days are generally part of a celebration, fundraising activity or sporting event.

### Examples include:

- St Patrick's Day, Have a Heart Day, Marymount Day
- Swimming Carnival, Track & Field Carnival
- Camps.

### The following rules will apply on free dress days:

- Clothing, jewellery or other items must not be offensive, unsafe, revealing or likely to disrupt the normal school management
- Shoes must be enclosed
- Long hair must be tied back
- Normal jewellery and make-up rules apply.

## Special circumstances

**The Marymount College Uniform Policy incorporates strategies to accommodate the special needs and circumstances of students.**

These needs are negotiated between parents, Head of Year and the Assistant Principal Pastoral Care.

Examples of special circumstances may include:

- Student medical conditions
- Student physical attributes or requirements
- Sport and PE

## Representing the College

**Students training or representing the College in a sport are required to wear full sports uniform to and from training and are to change into formal uniform at the completion of training.**

If the sport has a special training shirt and/or team uniform, it is permitted to be worn at training and before/after school.

## Health & Physical Education (HPE)

Students not wearing the correct uniform, shoes or hat for HPE lessons will receive a PBL referral after 3 breaches per term.

## Request for uniform variations

Students require a note written by their parent/carer to seek a uniform variation.

- The note is to be presented to their Head of Year (HOY) upon arrival at school.
- If granted, the student receives a uniform variation slip, signed by their HOY.

## Chewing gum

Chewing Gum is not permitted at Marymount College.

## Hair

**For all students, hair should be neat, clean and tidy.**

- Hair should not be cut or coloured in an unusual or extreme way, be shaved at less than a 3 or have lines or patterns.
- Mullet and undercut haircuts are not permitted.
- Students with unusual or extreme hair will not be permitted to return to the College until the colour is removed or the cut is more acceptable.
- When leaning forward the hair should not obscure the face.
- Hair longer than the top of the collar should be tied back
- Beards, goatees, moustaches, rattails or long sideburns are not permitted.
- Patterned scrunchies, hair ties, and ribbons are not permitted.

## Jewellery, make-up, and piercings

- Students are not permitted to wear make-up.
- False eyelashes are not to be worn to school.
- No jewellery is to be worn except for a plain wristwatch, or a plain cross which may be worn with an appropriate chain.
- Students may wear one plain stud or sleeper in each lower ear lobe.
- Large, jewelled studs or drop earrings are not permitted.
- Lip, nose, eyebrow, tongue and other visible piercings are not permitted.
- Clear piercings are not permitted under any circumstances, nor is it allowable to cover a piercing with a band-aid.

## Tattoos

Visible tattoos are not permitted.

## Fingernails

Fingernails should be clean and presentable. Students should not wear false nails of any kind. Nails should be free of coloured polish. Clear polish is acceptable.

## Sanctions

**Our school community supports the application of the following sanctions for breaches of the Marymount College Uniform Policy.**

These include:

- Uniform Detention
  - Students in breach of the uniform policy will be issued with a uniform detention.
  - Students who fail to attend their uniform detention receive a PBL for not following teacher directions.
  - Failure to attend the PBL results in a suspension.
- Preventing students from attending or participating in any activity or event for which they are representing the school.
- Providing verbal and/or written communication to parents/carers of students who do not meet the requirements of the College Uniform Policy.
- Withdrawal and suspension.



## Formal Uniform

The full school uniform is to be worn whilst travelling to and from school (except on designated sports days) and at all College functions. The uniform is to be worn well fitted, clean and in good condition.

Pants	<p>Marymount navy long pants May be worn in any term.</p>	Shorts	<p>Marymount charcoal dress shorts worn with Marymount belt</p>
Socks	<p>Socks short plain white with navy trim Navy blue 70 denier opaque tights may be worn with the school skirt in any term.</p>	Pants	<p>Marymount charcoal long pants</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• May be worn in any term.</li> </ul> <p>To be worn with Marymount leather belt and ankle length plain grey socks.</p>
Hair ties	<p>Girls with long hair are required to own a Marymount hair tie/ribbon and to wear for occasions such as College Mass, Liturgies, school photo day, and excursions.</p>	Belt	<p>Marymount leather belt</p>
		Socks	<p>Marymount long grey marle socks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• worn up to the knee.</li> </ul>



Unisex Items	
Shoes	<p>Black, laced, traditional style with leather uppers and blocked heel.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Only black leather, lace-up traditional style shoes with heel are allowed.</li><li>• Black joggers sold as school shoes or shoes with pointed toes or buckles are not part of the uniform.</li></ul>
Hat	<p>Marymount navy embroidered bucket hat with house colours on reverse side.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The College bucket hat is compulsory for all students and must be worn at all times when outdoors.</li><li>• The hat is not to be worn indoors.</li><li>• The reverse colour is to be student's house colour.</li><li>• The hat must be free of graffiti and in good condition.</li></ul>
Bag	<p>Marymount College navy backpack (compulsory)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Canvas carry bags are not permitted to be used as a school bag</li></ul>
Laptop bag	Marymount College laptop bag (compulsory)
Jumper	Marymount V-neck navy jumper (optional)
Soft shell jacket	<p>Marymount navy soft shell jacket. (optional)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Year 7-9 students only.</li></ul>
Blazer	<p>Navy Marymount blazer:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 2023: Compulsory for Year 10 students. Optional for Year 11 &amp; 12</li><li>• 2024: Compulsory for Year 10 &amp; 11 students. Optional for Year 12</li><li>• 2025: Compulsory for Year 10, 11 &amp; 12.</li></ul>

## Sport Uniform

Students are not permitted to arrive at school or leave at the end of the day while wearing their Sports Uniform. The exception is on Thursday or when special permission is given. eg excursions, training or reflection days.

- Year 12 students have permission to wear their Year 12 Jersey on Thursday with the sport uniform, and during exam shut down as outlined in the Senior Jersey agreement.
- Wearing of the College bucket hat is compulsory when outdoors.

Polo	Marymount light blue with navy trim
Shorts	Marymount navy blue shorts
Socks	Socks short plain white with navy trim
Shoes	Traditional joggers Sports shoes are to be traditional runners of any colour. Slip-on style, canvas, flat soled skate, or ankle high basketball shoes are not permitted. Sports shoes must have a gripped sole. Students wearing incorrect shoes will be placed in the PBL classroom until corrected.
Swimming	Sky blue swimming cap with Marymount College print
Tracksuit	Optional navy embroidered zip-up jacket with light blue trim. Optional navy stadium pant. The College tracksuit can only be worn with the sports uniform on Thursday. The tracksuit jacket cannot be worn with the formal school uniform. These are optional items.
Year 12 Jersey	Optional Year 12 jersey. May only be worn on a Thursday with the College sports uniform.
