A proud sporting history

Marymount College has a proud history as a competitive sports school on the Gold Coast.

We have many sporting teams that participate in state-wide competitions: AFL; Basketball; Cricket; Netball; Oztag, Rugby League, Rugby 7's/Union and Touch Football. These teams train on thursday afternoons and outside of school hours to be able to perform at their best on the competition days.

Facilities

A full gymnasium, including a core, cardio and video analysis room is utilised by the teams, as well as our plentiful sports fields. Our indoor facility allows for one netball court or two basketball courts, in addition we have two outdoor netball and two outdoor basketball courts. Our undercover training areas allow for training regardless of weather conditions. These, together with expert coaching, help improve our student's sporting ability.

Goals

Education is the primary focus. All players must perform well in classes, both academically and attitudinally, to remain in the Sporting Teams Programs. We aim to improve the following qualities in each of our boys and girls:

AFL

Marymount Junior and Senior teams participate in the state-wide AFLQ Schools Cup throughout the year. This competition is open to all schools in Queensland, including those considered Schools of Excellence for AFL. Marymount has built a solid reputation as a competitive AFL school based on recent performances in this competition. In 2024, the Open Boys team again finished in the top 16 in the state, with the Open Girls and Junior Boys finishing in the top 8 in the state. Our Junior Girls went all the way through, making it to the top 4 playoffs on the Sunshine Coast, finishing as the 3rd best school in the state.

2024 was significant for AFL as we played our first game on our new AFL field. We look forward to maintaining and improving our performance in the years to come. The Marymount AFL teams are dedicated to performing to the best of their ability and supporting their teammates. They pride themselves on their discipline both on and off the field. We look forward to the expansion of Q Cup from four teams up to six.

BASKETBALL

Marymount Sophomore, Junior, and Senior teams participate in the state-wide Champion Basketball School of Queensland tournament held at the end of Term 3 and the start of Term 4. This competition is open to all schools in Queensland, including those considered Schools of Excellence for Basketball.

Marymount has built a strong reputation as a competitive basketball school on the Gold Coast. We have competed in five out of the six age categories for the first time, with our Junior Girls working through the Wildcard process. With fantastic coaching and management staff, we look forward to maintaining and improving our performance in the years to come. The Marymount Basketball teams are dedicated to representing the College to the best of their ability and supporting their teammates. They are a credit to their school, staff, and families for their character both on and off the court.



NETBALL

Marymount Junior and Senior teams participate in the Catholic Cup in Brisbane. The girls in Years 7 to 9 also participate in the Vicki Wilson Shield in Term 2, and those in Years 10 to 12 play in the Vicki Wilson Cup.

In 2024, the Makos had four teams playing in the Hinterland Monday night competition at Mudgeeraba, and two playing on Wednesday nights at Palm Beach. The Makos 1 girls were in the top division against very experienced netballers, where they finished 4th. This competition is great preparation for the girls who want to trial for the QISSN (Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Netball) Competition, played every year in the first week of the mid-year holidays.

In 2024, at the QISSN carnival, the Marymount team finished 5th out of 64 teams, our best finish in modern times. Marymount has an excellent history of placing well at QISSN, and since the carnival started in 2000, they have won the QISSN Cup (1st place) three times and the Lara Nilsson Trophy (9th place) three times. We look forward to continually improving our performance in the years to come. The Marymount Makos Netball teams have developed an excellent spirit and are dedicated to performing to the best of their ability. They pride themselves on their discipline both on and off the court.

OZTAG

Marymount teams have participated in the state-wide All Schools Oztag Championships since 2018. These championships are held around July/August each year and are open to all schools in Queensland. Marymount fields teams in the Year 12 Girls & Boys (combining our Year 11 & 12s), Year 10 Girls & Boys (combining our Year 9 & 10s), and Year 8 Girls & Boys (combining our Year 7 & 8s) divisions. Over the course of their participation in the All Schools Championships, Marymount has built a solid reputation as the top Oztag school in Queensland. We have consistently made it through the pool phases of all the respective divisions, winning many state titles along the way, with 2022 being a stand-out year where Marymount Makos won all 6 divisions that we entered.

We look forward to maintaining and improving our performance in the years to come. The Marymount Oztag teams are dedicated to performing to the best of their ability and supporting their teammates. The Makos pride themselves on their discipline both on and off the field.



RUGBY LEAGUE

Marymount Boys Year 7/8, Year 9/10 and Open Teams participate in the Gold Coast Titans Schools League competitions in Terms 1 and 2. Marymount were the boys open age Titans Cup Premiers in 2007, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. A hotly contested 1st XIII is selected to participate in the Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Rugby League Competition (Confraternity Shield), which is the largest schoolboy Rugby League carnival in Australia with over 50 Catholic and Independent Colleges from around Queensland and beyond. During Term 3 the 1st XIII participate in the national NRL Schoolboys Competition.

2019 saw the introduction of a girls' team in the Karyn Murphy Cup. In 2020, we entered our Open girls' team into the inaugural Girls Confraternity Shield. In 2021, our girls played at Confraternity on the first two days and were undefeated when COVID cancelled the competition at the halfway point. In 2022, our girls were able to complete the full Confraternity competition where they went through undefeated to win the inaugural Girls Confraternity Shield, led by captain and current Titan, Lily-Rose Kolc. In 2023 and 2024, the girls finished a very strong 3rd.

We look forward to continually improving our performance in all areas. The Marymount Makos Rugby League teams have developed an excellent spirit, are dedicated to performing to the best of their ability and pride themselves on their discipline on and off the field.

RUGBY 7's/UNION

The Marymount Rugby program is a combination of 15-a-side and 7-a-side formats. Marymount are a key participant in the Gold Coast Super Schools Cup- a 15-a-side tournament for Under 15s in Term 1. In 2025, we look forward to engaging with the GCDRU 10s tournament in Term 1.

The 7's program is for both girls and boys of all ages. Marymount enter an array of Q7 tournaments and have great success utilising students from a broad range of sporting backgrounds. These tournaments are in Term 4 and we are blessed with an excellent suite of rugby coaches.

TOUCH FOOTBALL

Marymount teams have participated in the state-wide All Schools Touch Championships since 1998. These championships are held in October each year and are open to all schools in Queensland, including those who are considered Schools of Excellence for Touch Football.

Marymount fields teams in the Open Girls, Open Boys, 15 Years Girls, 15 Years Boys, 13 Years Girls and 13 Years Boys divisions. Over the course of their participation at the All Schools Championships, Marymount has built a solid reputation as a competitive Touch Football school. Marymount has consistently made it through the pool phases of the respective divisions, placing them in the top 16 teams in the state, with a best finish of the top 4. We look forward to maintaining and improving our performance in the years to come. The Marymount Touch Football teams are dedicated to performing to the best of their ability and to supporting their teammates. They pride themselves on their discipline both on and off the field.
